### **Spill**

Spill is a social media app that allows users to create, share and discuss the culture. Spill was created by former Black Twitter engineers and designers.



### **Fanbase**

Fanbase is a social media app focused on content creation. Users can create, share and monetize their content similar to TikTok



### **Blue Sky Social**

Blue Sky is a microblogging media service, with enhanced protections to eliminate trolling, mis and disinformation.



### **Inpathy**

### URBAN ONE **Radio One**

Radio One is a multimedia company that primarily serves Black audiences through radio stations, digital media, and television. It is a leading urban media brand known for its influence in music, culture, and news.

### **The Grio**

The Grio is a digital media platform that focuses on news, culture, and entertainment from a Black perspective. It covers topics related to politics, social issues, and pop culture, amplifying Black voices and stories.

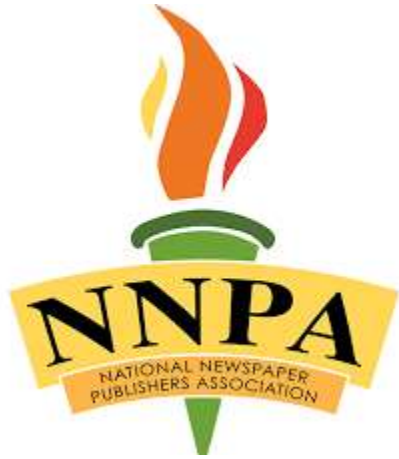


### **Michigan Chronicle**

### **National Newspaper Publishers Association**

The National Newspaper Publishers Association is the largest and most influential Black-owned media resource in the country. The NNPA network includes the Michigan Chronicle, Chicago Defender and other historically black centers news organizations.

### **Black Star Network**

Curated by acclaimed journalist Roland S. Martin, Black Star Network is a over-the-top media network that produces and distributes content for the Black community; delivering the thoughts of influential insights on business, politics and the community.

### Calendly

Founded in 2013 by salesman Tope Awotona, who was becoming frustrated with the hassle of scheduling sales calls, it offers a platform that automates external meetings, letting participants select time slots and integrating with their preferred calendar of choice.

Atlanta-based fraud-prevention company Pindrop is looking to disrupt that system with its proprietary voiceprint-detecting software, which lets you unlock your account through speech. Working with dozens of major banks, insurers, and financial institutions, the company has stopped over \$2 billion in fraud since launching in 2011.
